First, we analysed a young pre-adolescent sample (9 – 10 years old) and thus, findings may not be generalizable to older samples, including adults. Despite this, our results might be valuable as the early adolescent phases represent a highly vulnerable period for onset of depression, but most of the prior literature has focused on adults (Baune et al. , 2014 ; Allott et al. , 2016).
